However, the necessary number of votes were not present in person or by proxy to pass this Amendment. The votes at the annual meeting were carried over to the February meeting at which time there were seventeen proxy votes cast, all in favor of the Amendment Resolution which met the requirement and thus the Amendment passed.

1996 Monte Carlo


