Dear Members,


As many of you know we have been working on submitting applications for Federal & State Grants to assist us in slowing erosion in our watershed. We have formed the Indian Creek Watershed Alliance with Indian Lake Improvement Assoc., Old Oakland Golf Course and MSD of Lawrence Township (Craig Middle School).

We applied for a 319 Grant with Indiana Dept. of Environmental Management (IDEM). We were not awarded any monies for 1999, however we were awarded \$ 82,000.00 for the year 2000! That of course is only nine months away. The money will be spent to slow and control erosion along Indian Creek and Indian Lake. No Grant money will be allowed for dredging. There are many other projects that can be done around our Lake.


Another line of attack is the City of Lawrence. We are asking that our common property taxes be lowered and some money given back to the Association from past years. This will help our Dredging fund out tremendously.

There is a lot of things happening this year. As a Community, we can overcome many problems as long as we keep working together.
