Dear Indian Lake Neighbor,

Has there ever been a prettier spring at Indian Lake than this year? The dogwoods and redbuds along with all the other flowering trees have been gorgeous. For those who have not been out exploring the lake this spring, we have two families of Canadian geese and goslings this year. Also, an Osprey and a mink have been seen!

The dredging process has started and is progressing well! We are removing about seven years of silt and are excited about having the use of the East end of the lake again.

The existing three boat slips have been rented for the summer with the fourth to remain open for people who wish to load and unload at the beach area. Those whose names were drawn are Joe Hoone, Vivian Matthews and Mike Carter. More slips will be built with Beverly Minter having use of the first one. If you have questions about the slips or would like to rent one, please contact Joe Rohrman 9823-42180 or Ed Thomas (823-9618). The slips rent for \$150 for one season.

An unidentified pontoon boat has been spotted at the South Beach. This boat needs to be rescued by its owners, moved from the floating dock and the lot numbers placed on it. Please remember it is the responsibility of each boat owner to have their lot number on their boats. This is important for identification purposes.

Recently, some Board members had to remove yard refuse from the dumpsters at the South Beach. Please remember the dumpsters at the beaches are not for private use and the trash haulers will not pick up yard refuse.

Extensive work was done to the tennis courts last year. To ensure its playability and to protect your investment, please help our Indian Lake children understand there are to be NO WHEELS ON THE TENNIS COURT! This includes bicycles, tricycles, roller skates, roller blades, scooters, etc. A sign will be put up in the near future stating that the tennis courts are to be used for tennis only.

A copy of the Lake Use and Water Safety Regulations are attached for your use and review.. Have a great, safe summer and enjoy Indian Lake!






