President's Message

Fellow Indian Lake Residents,

As I mentioned in the last Smoke Signal, the main topic your board is working on, is dredging of the lake. At the August board meeting, Bud Nelson stated that he had met with a representative from Dredging Technologies to take depth samples for the purpose of preparing a lake study. This lake study was used by Dredging Technologies to put together a proposal as to the cost of dredging the lake.

Several board members met with John Burns of Dredging Technologies on Saturday, August 13th, to go over his dredging proposal. The cost is about \$12,000.00 per acre. Your board will be discussing this proposal and the lake study at the September board meeting. A decision will be made at that time on the dredging project.

Dredging could start this fall after permits are obtained from the Department of Natural Resources and we complete the work on the silt containment area at the east end of the lake.

The next board meeting will be September 7th at 7:00pm at the Indian Lake Country Club.
You are all welcome.


